In addition to class 1 and class 3 e-bikes being allowed on all club group rides, class 2 e-bikes (pedal assist e-bike with a throttle) are now allowed, but only on social-pace and steady-pace group rides. If your e-bike (or other motorized bike) does not meet the class 1, 2, or 3 designations, it is not allowed on any club rides. See the e-bike policy page on the website for all the details.

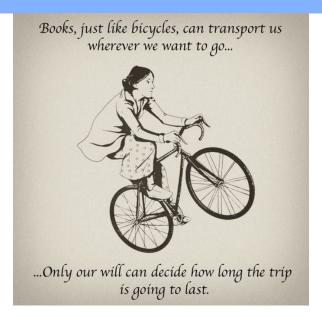

Letter of Support for Centennial Trail South:

A letter of support from our BIKES Club has been sent to support the application Snohomish County is preparing for the federal Reconnecting Communities and Neighborhoods program for planning and design of the Centennial Trail South corridor, a 12-mile regional, shared-use trail that will connect the City of Snohomish to the City of Woodinville. This trail segment will link the Centennial Trail to the Eastrail, creating a 72-mile continuous trail corridor connecting 3 counties and 9 cities. The benefits we see include:

- Significant expansion of safe routes for bicyclists to use for environmentally friendly forms of recreation and transportation.
- Stimulating bicycle tourism for day rides and multi-day tours across our region.

Hello Ride leaders,

How to canceling a Ride listing.

As we move into Fall, and weather becomes less predictably good for riding, we need to be aware of the process for canceling a ride

First, do not delete your event. Find your event from the Admin view of the club website. Open it, click "edit" and add " Cancelled" to the title. Save.

Then click the 'Allow registration' button to turn off registration.

After saving this, send an email to the registrants through the basic and simple options as spelled out here.https://bikesclub.org/page-1791886

At the recent RL donut and gab session, one of the topics was pacing of a ride. All of our pace categories span a couple of mph (10-12, 12-14 etc). As well as trying to be conscientious about maintaining that pace, and knowing where your riders are, it's important that your ride listing is clear about the terrain. Regroups are usually necessary; try to find enough room to do this safely.

As always, thanks for listing rides. They are what makes this club tick.
